What should I expect at my initial visit?

Plan to be in the clinic for 2-3 hours for your first visit. A typical visit will include:

- Pre-appointment electrocardiogram (ECG) test- a device used to record the electrical activity of the heart.
- Appointment with your provider.
- Post appointment testing (if needed) including blood draw or ultrasound studies.

You may need to complete pre-appointment testing before you come for your visit. This gives your provider the opportunity to discuss results with you during your visit. If this is needed, we will assist you in finding a testing option close to home. Depending on the nature of your visit, there are times you will meet with doctor trainees and nurse practitioners before meeting your PH doctor. After meeting with you, they will review your case with the PH doctor.

What kind of education will I receive?

During your appointment you will receive a blue and gold education folder that includes information about pulmonary hypertension, how to best manage your

symptoms and our contact information. When you check out the staff will also print an after visit summary which may have additional information for you.
