



How Do I Transfer My Hormone Therapy (HRT)?

To transfer your hormone therapy (HRT) to a Michigan Medicine provider, you will first schedule an appointment with one of our available HRT providers.

Please be advised that the Women’s Clinic located in Von Voigtlander Women’s Hospital – and the Von Voigtlander Women’s Hospital generally – have a particular focus on “women’s health” as it relates to reproduction and childbearing. We understand that not all patients wish to be in that environment, but we assure you that Dr. Stroumsa welcomes all patients to receive care through the Women’s Clinic, regardless of their gender identity.

What will my new HRT provider need at my first appointment?

Your new HRT provider will need to see some of your previous medical records about your HRT prescription. These records should include:

- The office note from your most recent appointment with your hormone provider where you discussed your HRT prescription
- Your most recent lab results regarding your hormones.

If your new HRT provider does not receive these records by your first appointment they may delay prescribing you HRT.

How do I send my medical records to my new HRT provider?

You should contact your current HRT provider and request your medical records.

There are two ways to give your medical records to your new HRT provider:

- Ask your current HRT provider to fax or mail the records to your new HRT provider's office. You can ask for your new HRT provider's office fax number and mailing address in advance when you schedule your first appointment with them.
- Bring your records with you to your first appointment with your new HRT provider.
