Your pregnancy care provider (nurse midwife, nurse practitioner or doctor) will determine whether you need high-risk (Maternal Fetal Medicine) care during your pregnancy. This could occur at the beginning of pregnancy or as the pregnancy progresses. High-risk clinicians care for you and your baby, in

pregnancy and through the first 6 weeks postpartum. Your referring pregnancy care provider then takes care of you for the first year after birth.

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
