

#### What is an Electrogastrogram?

A test that measures the electrical activity moving through the stomach muscles. This electrical activity controls the stomach muscles' contractions.

### What can I expect from an Electrogastrogram?

- 1. You will be asked to lie down face up on a gurney.
- 2. Seven patches are placed on your stomach.
- 3. You will be recorded for 15 minutes so we can get your baseline measurements.
- 4. You will drink a meal replacement drink (approximately 5 minutes).
- 5. The final 40 minutes will be used to evaluate your stomach's electrical activity in response to the meal replacement drink.

## How do I prepare for an Electrogastrogram?

7 days before the test:

- No opioid medications
- 3 days before the test:
- No Nausea medication
- No Spasmodic medication
- 8 hours before the test:
- Nothing by mouth

### Can I take my medicine before an Electrogastrogram?

• Take critical medicines, such as those for your heart, blood pressure, breathing, or seizures, with sips of water on the morning of the test.

Do not take noncritical medicines, including over-the-counter medicines and ٠ supplements unless your doctor or nurse has advised you otherwise.
