

8-Hour Educational Block of Care on the Pediatric Ventilator Unit

What is an 8-hour educational block of care?

The purpose of the 8-hour educational block of care is to provide caregivers with an opportunity to receive education in the everyday care of their child.

What are staff (registered nurses and respiratory therapists) expected to do?

- Instruct and include caregivers in all activities related to providing their child care and medication.
- Take vital signs, document food and fluid intake and output, emergency checks, and all usual charting (recording information on the patient's medical chart).
- Write a note about the caregiver's participation in all of their child's care.

What are caregivers expected to do?

There will be three 8-hour blocks of care.

- Each caregiver must participate in at least 1 block of care.
 - One of the blocks of care will be overnight after the ventilator education.
- One caregiver must be at the bedside awake, alert, and attentive for the full 8 hours.
- Caregivers must be engaged and active in all care and medication activities.
- Caregivers will learn how to assess and respond to alarms.
- This is an opportunity to ask lots of questions and gain experience and confidence in your child's care.

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
