

Why are supplies different at home?

In the hospital there is a large number of supplies because each staff member takes care of many patients. To reduce the risk of infection, staff have to use and throw away supplies often. Once you go home, however, there will not be an unlimited supply and you will have to learn to manage your supplies.

How many supplies can I expect?

Supplies are delivered every month. The amount you get of each item (quantity) is controlled by your insurance plan. The quantity is different for each plan, so you can't compare your quantity of supplies with your friend. Many insurance plans follow the same supply quantity as Michigan Medicaid. For this reason, the numbers we give you on the chart (last page) are the Medicaid quantities. You may get more or less.

What do I do if I run out?

You can call your Durable Medical Equipment supplier (DME) and ask for more. Sometimes a DME will give you a few supplies to get you through the month. However, sometimes the DME will not give you supplies. You may have to purchase additional supplies to last the rest of the month.

How can I prevent running out?

As you spend more time at home you will become familiar with the quantities you receive. You will learn how to use your supplies carefully to get through the month.

My DME tells me to get a "letter of medical necessity" and then they can get me all the supplies I want. How do I get this?

A letter of medical necessity comes from the vent team. The letter provides information about a condition your child has that requires more supplies than allotted. The medical team has to provide documentation of the condition and why the additional supplies are necessary. Letters of medical necessity are rare and cannot be used to cover wasteful use of supplies.

What if an item I need is not covered?

The medical team will discuss this with you. If the item is medically necessary, the team will write a letter in an effort to get the item covered. A letter of medical necessity is not a guarantee the item will be approved. If your insurance denies the request for an item, we will look at alternatives or you have the option to purchase the item.

Can I buy medical supplies?

Yes! Medical supplies are widely available online. Use an online search engine to look for the best price on the items you wish to buy. If the item requires a prescription, ask the team and we will be happy to provide one.
