


Why do I need Kayexalate?

The amount of potassium in your body is high. Kayexalate (Sodium polystyrene sulfonate) is a medication that lowers the level of potassium in the blood.



What problems can high potassium cause?

- Potassium keeps your heartbeat normal. High amounts of potassium can cause abnormal heartbeat and lead to emergency department visits or hospital admission.
- You may also have diarrhea, weakness or muscle cramps

Your doctor prescribed Kayexalate to reduce the amount of potassium in your body and avoid heart problems and emergencies

How do I take Kayexalate?

- 1. Mix 4 teaspoons of Kayexalate into 2 ounces of water (2 medicine cups).
- 2. Mix well.
- 3. Drink the liquid.
