Top prize for each category will be \$500.00 and second prize will be \$100.00. Dr. Emanuel will be one of the judges.

ABSTRACT SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Title & Author(s): Underline name of author(s) and who will be the presenter
- Contact Address and Information: Specify e-mail address of author serving as primary contact
- Introduction and Objective: Indicate purpose of the study
- Methods: Describe sample, procedures, and measurements
- Results: Summarize findings in detail or questions to be discussed (for works in progress)
- Conclusion: Present a summary statement
- Font and Size: Arial, 11 pt.
- Margins: Minimum of 1" margins on top, bottom and sides if abstract fills the page
- Center abstract on an 8 ½ x 11 white sheet of paper
- Word Limit: 500
