

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Introducing the LSO

The Life Sciences Orchestra (LSO) is the symphonic orchestra for members of the life sciences community at U-M. It is one of the programs of Gifts of Art with a focus on faculty, staff and students at Michigan Medicine. Members represent:

The LSO was created in the fall of 2000 by a small group of musicians at the U-M Medical School and the U-M Hospitals and Health Centers under the umbrella of the Michigan Medicine Gifts of Art Program. Now in its 18th season, the LSO draws nearly 2,000 audience members for each of two free concerts a year.

The mission of the LSO is to offer musicians in the life sciences a creative outlet by providing an opportunity to play in a large ensemble, while building a sense of community across the different life sciences areas throughout campus.

About the Gifts of Art Program

One of the first and most comprehensive arts in medicine programs in the nation, Gifts of Art brings the world of art and music to Michigan Medicine. The LSO fulfills one of Gifts of Art's objectives, that of providing arts opportunities for those in health related fields.

Some of Gifts of Art's other programs:

- Public Performances – weekly concerts
- Music While You Wait – volunteer musicians in waiting areas
- Nine art galleries – exhibiting 35 shows a year
- Bedside Music – specially trained musicians on patient floors
- Bedside Art – artists in patient units
- Art Cart – lending library for inpatients of framed art prints
- Artist in Residence – hospital-wide art making projects
- Story Studio – recording patient stories at the bedside

Gifts of Art partners with Professor Kenneth Kiesler and the U-M School of Music, Theatre and Dance and is the official representative of the Life Sciences Orchestra. All Gifts of Art programs are free and open to the public.

Chelsea Gallo, the Gilbert S. Omenn, M.D. Music Director

Chelsea Gallo is pursuing a Doctorate of Musical Arts at U-M with Kenneth Kiesler. Her past conducting engagements include the Zilina Philharmonic, Slovak Sinfonietta, Jan Albrecht Symphonic Ensemble, Prayner Konservatorium Symphony Orchestra, and Vienna Konservatorium Opera Orchestra.

Last season included the Žilina Philharmonic of Slovakia, Orquesta Esperanza Azteca of Mexico, and assisting in the U-M production of *Le Nozze di Figaro*. Gallo has been conductor of the U-M Campus Philharmonia Orchestra, and assistant conductor to Benjamin Britten's opera, *A Midsummer Night's Dream*.

Gallo became the first woman to receive her Masters of Arts in Orchestral Conducting through the dual study program of the Vienna Konservatorium and Jan Albrecht Academy. Before graduating, she assisted and covered with the Brno Philharmonic in the Czech Republic.

As music director of the Cosmos Chamber Orchestra, Gallo is devoted to uniting scientific and artistic communities including work with organizations such as NASA, Lockheed Martin, National Institute of Aerospace, and European Space Agency, among others. The orchestra recorded music for the Orion ETF-1 Mission and the Hubble Space Telescope 25th anniversary celebrations. Upcoming performances in Vienna include appearances with the Cosmos Chamber Orchestra at the United Nations.

Gallo has participated in concert for masterclasses and festivals in the US and Europe including the Bacau Filarmonica, Lithuanian State Symphony Orchestra, Bratislava National Opera, New Symphony of Bulgaria, Miami Music Festival, and Medomak Symphony Orchestra, among others.

Hill Auditorium

Standing in the heart of the University of Michigan campus, Hill Auditorium is a premier venue for University of Michigan and metro Detroit events. With a seating capacity of just over 3,500, its Frieze Memorial Organ and excellent acoustics, Hill is an outstanding performance venue, and many world class performers hold the hall in high regard.

Former U-M regent Arthur Hill bequeathed \$200,000 to the university for the construction of the auditorium for lectures, concerts and other university events, and former UMS President Charles Sink raised another \$150,000 to help complete the concert hall in 1913.

The hall was designed by the Detroit firm of Albert Kahn and Assoc., which designed many notable structures, including the landmark Art Deco Fisher Building in Detroit, Michigan.

Hill Auditorium underwent a major renovation by the original architects with Quinn Evans Architects, and was closed for 18 months. It reopened in January 2004 with restorations to the brick, stone and terracotta exterior, as well as to the interior ceiling adornments, wall painting and organ piping. Patrons also appreciated the air conditioning, elevators and new lower level lobby.

Known internationally for its superb acoustics that highlight everything from the softest high notes to the most thunderous climaxes, Hill Auditorium is known and loved throughout the musical world.

The LSO performs two free concerts each season at Hill Auditorium.

Rehearsal and Concert Schedule

Unless otherwise noted, regular rehearsals and/or sectionals will be held on **Sunday evenings** in the Rehearsal Hall of the Earl V. Moore Building, School of Music, North Campus. Rehearsals **begin promptly at 7 p.m. and end at 9:30 p.m.** Members should plan on arriving at 6:45 p.m. to allow sufficient time to check-in, warm-up and tune. Send a message to isoabsence@umich.edu regarding both planned and unplanned absences. Keep in mind that after three absences for any reason, your participation in the LSO concert will be at the discretion of the music director.

All rehearsals include a 15 minute mid rehearsal break. Each week, a different section of the orchestra is asked to provide snacks for members to enjoy during this break.

Should inclement weather force the cancellation of a rehearsal (or a change in venue), we will endeavor to notify all members via email and the LSO website and Facebook page ASAP.

Special rehearsals may be called by our music director as required. Musicians are provided reminders and updates of all rehearsals, including any changes of rehearsal times or locations. It is the **responsibility of each member** to stay informed by keeping a **current email address on file** with the Orchestra Committee. Please email them your updates at orchestra@umich.edu.

Transportation and Parking

We urge members to carpool, make use of the University of Michigan bus system or use other forms of transportation to get to and from rehearsals on North Campus.

Parking is available near the Earl V. Moore building. Enter through the new main entrance and turn left. The Rehearsal Hall will be on your right. On Sunday evenings, all parking in the Moore Bldg. lot is free and open to all. During business hours on weekdays, Blue, Gold and paid visitor spots are available. Bicycle, motorcycle and moped parking is available on the east and west sides of the building. Members are urged to **exercise caution** and **walk in groups** when arriving to or departing from rehearsals **during evening hours**.

LSO Orchestra Policies

Membership

Entry into the LSO is by audition only.

The LSO gives first priority to members of the U-M life sciences community who are able to fulfill the particular position. We define life sciences community to include all the areas listed on page 1 of this handbook.

Anyone who has an affiliation with these units, whether as faculty, staff, graduate students, alumni or retirees, are welcome to audition.

Undergraduates in junior or senior standing with a declared life sciences major may also audition for the LSO. No course credit is offered for participating in the LSO.

If more players are needed for certain instrumental sections than are available from the life sciences community, those positions may be filled by non-life sciences musicians at the discretion of the LSO Music Director and the LSO Executive Committee.

Music Fee

The annual LSO membership fee is \$50 due at the beginning of the season and collected at the first rehearsal. Please pay by check made payable to the U-M Life Sciences Orchestra, or cash. Payments above \$50 are welcome, and the amount in excess of the \$50 membership fee is tax-deductible. Attendance

We all have busy schedules, but please respect the group by planning your schedule to allow you to attend all rehearsals and/or sectionals and to stay for the entire length of each session. If you must miss a rehearsal, either planned or unplanned, email Isoabsence@umich.edu as soon as possible – no later than the Thursday before the rehearsal.

Unexcused or frequent absences are unfair to the other members of your section and are troublesome for the entire orchestra. If you miss several rehearsals with no excuse, or if you have missed three for any reason, your participation in the concert will be at the discretion of the music director.

Any member who misses a concert week rehearsal may be asked to excuse him/herself from the orchestra and become a member of the audience.

Music and Equipment

Members will sign out a music folder at the first rehearsal. Extra music requests should be directed to Angie Noble at angnoble761@gmail.com **at least three days before the music is required.**

All members are expected to arrive at each rehearsal with their full set of signed out music, along with any instrumental accessories (e.g., mutes) called for in the music to be rehearsed.

Members are required to turn in their music immediately after the end of each concert performance.

Concert Dress

Unless otherwise specified, concert dress consists of the following:

For women: black shoes and hose or socks, black pants or long skirt, and a black top, long-sleeved preferred.

For men: black shoes and socks, black tuxedo or suit, long sleeved white shirt, and a black bow tie.

No jeans, no running shoes or sandals, no T-shirts, no pants less than full length, no sleeveless or tank-style tops.

Communication

If you have general questions or ideas for the committee and the music director, send them to orchestra@umich.edu. The email list for the entire orchestra is moderated to prevent inappropriate use – that is, only committee members and the music director may email all members at once. If you have something that you would like to suggest be shared with all members, such as information about an upcoming concert of interest, please send it to orchestra@umich.edu. LSO Executive Committee

The LSO Committee (LSOC) is a volunteer committee made up of members of the LSO and the director of the Gifts of Art Program. The committee handles much of the day to day business of running the orchestra, including:

- Schedules and oversees auditions
- Maintains the roster of LSO members and prospective members
- Schedules and publicizes all rehearsals and meetings
- Oversees member attendance and rehearsals
- Creates press releases and publicizes concerts
- Maintains website
- Selects and invites concert hosts
- Selects Spirit of the LSO award winner
- Drafts and updates orchestra policies
- Discusses member feedback and addresses any member issues or concerns

The LSOC meets mostly monthly during the academic year. Any member interested in serving on the committee or attending a meeting should email the committee at orchestra@umich.edu.
