Dear Baldwin:

I wrote Armstrong a couple of days ago to be sure and send out the notices for the meeting the first Monday in December.

I have heard from Mrs. Bliss and I think that her contribution to the Foundation will be brought up to date.

I wish you would do something regarding the plan of Mr. Hastings for planting up the Memorial. Mrs. Bliss, by the way, seems to be very much pleased with the little photograph I sent to her. I wish you would take those pencilled paper sketches of Mr. Hastings and have them reproduced, so that you can bring them down with you to the meeting of the Trustees. If I had thought of it I might have had that done here, but perhaps you can do it better.

I suggest that you have the engineer who made the survey, and who would have charge of the oversight of the work - I have forgotten his name - make an ink linen tracing and then have a set of blueprints made from this, so that we can discuss it in our full meeting. They will all be very much interested, particularly Mr. Lea, and we ought to get their ideas. Perhaps the engineer will have some better way of his own of getting at this, but the originals ought to be kept carefully by you.

I hope everything is going well and that you have no more illness in the village.
