Methods to Evaluate Student Performance

- Observation of performance by faculty.
- Observation of performance by house officers.

Course Description:

The student will function as a subintern on the inpatient obstetrical service, including the inpatient care of high-risk antepartum patients. It is expected that the student will develop skills to properly evaluate and manage normal and abnormal labor, as well as the ability to perform common intrapartum procedures. Students will also have the opportunity to participate in high-risk prenatal clinics and the Perinatal Assessment Center, where they may participate in ultrasound and genetic counseling. The student's final evaluation will be based on faculty and housestaff evaluation of participation, attitude, and fund of knowledge.
