Methods to Evaluate Student Performance

Student will be asked to give a 10-minute presentation at end of the month on a developmental and behavioral topic of their choosing.

Course Description:

The DBP Elective will offer the student exposure to common developmental and behavioral problems of children, including school function problems (learning disabilities, ADHD, oppositional behavior), developmental disabilities, autism, enuresis, encopresis, and others. The student will learn the standard of care in diagnosis and treatment of developmental and behavioral disorders. Students will gain a better understanding of the role of the community and schools in supporting child development. Students will learn how a developmental and behavioral focus can be incorporated into the delivery of primary care pediatrics. A good portion of this rotation will be devoted to time for specific readings. Students will be required to give a 10 minute oral presentation at the end of the month on a developmental and behavioral topic of their choosing.
