What is Lewy body dementia?

Lewy body dementia (LBD) is a brain disease that impairs thinking and often mobility. Common symptoms include hallucinations, sleep disturbances, stiffness, and fluctuating levels of awareness.

Separate virtual support groups are available for those with an early diagnosis of LBD and for caregivers or family members of those with LBD. *Northern Michigan virtual groups are currently combined with both caregivers and individuals with LBD attending together.

These support groups are hosted by the Rinne Lewy Body Dementia Initiative, a program of the Michigan Alzheimer's Disease Center.
