What do I do if I have concerns?

Emergency:

If you are experiencing an emergent alarm or emergency situation, call the VAD emergency number at **(734) 477-6722**. A member of the VAD team is on-call 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Non-emergency:

If you have a non-emergent situation (like verifying your clinic appointment, medication refills, or general questions), please call the Frankel Cardiovascular Call Center at **(734) 647-7321** Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM – 5:00 PM.

Follow these steps to call the Frankel Cardiovascular Call Center:

- 1. Dial (734) 647-7321.
- 2. Press option 2.
- 3. Listen to the automated message.
 - a. The message will ask you to "Press 1 for new patient" or "Hold and stay on the line."
- 4. Hold and stay on the line. **Do not press 1** for new patient.

<u>MyUofMHealth.org</u> is a secure online patient portal that gives you another way to communicate with your care team. This tool allows you to:

- Request, view, and cancel appointments, or self-schedule an appointment with an established provider
- Receive laboratory and other test results

 Send non-urgent messages to your care team (this can help you avoid "phone tag"!)

• Review prescription medications and request prescription renewals
